PCPICOP

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The Philippine Chemical and Pharmaceutical Industry Code of Practice (PCPICOP) is in consonance with the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) entered into by and between the various chemical and pharmaceutical associations and entities and the PDEA. The PCPICOP has established uniform procedures and common approach to prevent the diversion of precursor which will facilitate voluntary notification of suspicious transactions by the industry to law enforcement agencies.





PCPICOP OBJECTIVES

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- The establishment of a common system of practice that will be applied by the industry in handling chemicals to prevent diversion at source level;
- The development of an enhanced partnership and alliances between the industry and PDEA; and
- The training and education of company's staff to heighten awareness on the possibility of chemicals to be diverted for illicit purposes.
