UN SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTION 1540 (2004) – A SHORT INTRODUCTION (1)


- UNANIMOUSLY ADOPTED ON **28 APRIL 2004** UNDER **CHAPTER VII** OF THE UN CHARTER, AND REAFFIRMED BY MEANS OF FOUR FOLLOW-UP RESOLUTIONS
- PROLIFERATION OF NUCLEAR, CHEMICAL AND BIOLOGICAL WEAPONS, AS WELL AS THEIR MEANS OF DELIVERY, CONSTITUTES A THREAT TO INTERNATIONAL PEACE AND SECURITY
- BINDING INSTRUMENT WHICH ADDRESSES THE THREAT POSED BY NON-STATE ACTORS, INCLUDING TERRORISTS, OF ACQUIRING SUCH WEAPONS OR RELATED MATERIALS
- COMPLEMENTS RELEVANT MULTILATERAL TREATIES AND ARRANGEMENTS.






UN SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTION 1540 (2004) – A SHORT INTRODUCTION (2)

BASIC OBLIGATIONS ON STATES:



- ADOPT AND ENFORCE APPROPRIATE EFFECTIVE LAWS THAT PROHIBIT ANY NON-STATE ACTOR SUCH ACTIVITIES, INCLUDING ACTING AS AN ACCOMPLICE, OR TO ASSIST OR TO FINANCE
- DOMESTIC CONTROLS TO PREVENT THE PROLIFERATION OF THESE WEAPONS, I.E. CONTROLS OVER RELATED MATERIALS, MEASURES IN THE AREAS OF ACCOUNTING / SECURING, PHYSICAL PROTECTION, BORDER AND LAW ENFORCEMENT, EXPORT AND TRADE-RELATED CONTROLS
- RESOLUTION OUTLINES OBLIGATIONS RELATING TO WHAT STATES
 HAVE TO DO, BUT NOT HOW TO DO IT, MODALITIES OF
 IMPLEMENTATION IS A NATIONAL DECISION
- ASSISTANCE MECHANISM IS AVAILABLE





FOCUS ON BORDER AND EXPORT CONTROLS

No that all States shall take and enforce effective measures to ntrols to prevent the proliferation of nuclear, chemical, or and their means of delivery, including by establishing s over related materials and to this end shall:

- (a) Develop and maintain appropriate effective measures to account for and ure such items in production, use, storage or transport;
- (b) Develop and maintain appropriate effective physical protection measures;
- (c) Develop and maintain appropriate effective border controls and law enforcement efforts to detect, deter, prevent and combat, including through international cooperation when necessary, the illicit trafficking and brokering in such items in accordance with their national legal authorities and legislation and consistent with international law,
- (d) Establish, develop, review and maintain appropriate effective national export and trans-shipment controls over such items, including appropriate laws and regulations to control export, transit, trans-shipment and re-export and controls on providing funds and services related to such export and trans-shipment such as financing, and transporting that would contribute to proliferation, as well as establishing end-user controls; and establishing and enforcing appropriate criminal or civil penalties for violations of such export control laws and regulations;

- IMPETUS FOR A GREAT NUMBER OF STATES TO ESTABLISH OR REVIEW THEIR NATIONAL EXPORT CONTROL SYSTEMS
- IT'S **NOT ONLY ABOUT "EXPORT" CONTROLS:** RES. 1540 ACKNOWLEDGES THAT A NUMBER OF **RELATED ACTIVITIES** NEED TO BE CONTROLLED AS WELL (TRANSITS, TRANSSHIPMENTS, BROKERING, SERVICES ETC.)
- RES. 1540 RECOGNIZES THE UTILITY OF NATIONAL CONTROL LISTS AND **ENCOURAGES STATES TO REACH OUT TO INDUSTRY**
- IN SUMMARY, RES. 1540 IDENTIFIES **KEY ELEMENTS OF EFFECTIVE EXPORT CONTROL** SYSTEMS:
 - LEGISLATION (INCL. PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS)
 - **ENFORCEMENT CAPACITY**
 - INDUSTRY-GOVERNMENT RELATIONS



- SUBSIDIARY BODY OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL, COMPOSED OF THE FIFTEEN CURRENT MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL, ASSISTED IN ITS WORK BY A GROUP OF NINE EXPERTS
- CURRENT CHAIRMAN: AMB. KIM SOOK, REPUBLIC OF KOREA
- NOT A SANCTIONS COMMITTEE. DOES NOT INVESTIGATE OR PROSECUTE ALLEGED VIOLATIONS OF NON-PROLIFERATION OBLIGATIONS
- MANDATE AND SCOPE OF ACTIVITIES OF THE 1540 COMMITTEE ARE DERIVED FROM RESOLUTION 1540 (2004) AND SUBSEQUENT RESOLUTIONS 1673 (2006), 1810 (2008), and 1977 (2011)
- CURRENT MANDATE ENDS IN 2021
- FOUR COMMITTEE WORKING GROUPS, REPRESENTING THE FOUR KEY AREAS OF WORK:
 - (I) **MONITORING** AND NATIONAL IMPLEMENTATION;
 - (II) ASSISTANCE;
 - (III) **COOPERATION** WITH INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS;
 - (IV) TRANSPARENCY AND MEDIA OUTREACH




IMPLEMENTATION IN THE REGION – OP. 3 c) d), NATIONAL LEGAL FRAMEWORK *

States can convey requests for implementation assistance to the 1540 Committee

States are urged to provide a point of contact for assistance

Provision of resources to support the work of the 1540 Committee etc.

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States are called upon to provide a report on the implementation of the resolution and encouraged to provide additional information

States, international, regional and subregional organizations are urged to inform the 1540 Committee about areas in which they are able to provide assistance

The 1540
Committee is encouraged to actively engage in dialogue with States, including through visits to States at their invitation



HOW TO REQUEST OR OFFER ASSISTANCE?

- 1540 COMMITTEE ITSELF DOES NOT PROVIDE ASSISTANCE BUT HAS A **CLEARINGHOUSE AND** MATCH MAKING ROLE TO FACILITATE ASSISTANCE BY OTHERS FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF THE RESOLUTION
- ASSISTANCE REQUESTS SHOULD BE FORMALLY SUBMITTED BY MEMBER STATES TO THE 1540 COMMITTEE, IDEALLY BY USING THE **TEMPLATE** ON **ASSISTANCE**
- COMMITTEE AND EXPERTS WILL ENGAGE IN "MATCH MAKING": THEY WILL LIAISE WITH POTENTIAL PROVIDERS OF ASSISTANCE
- STATES AND INTERNATIONAL, REGIONAL AND SUBREGIONAL ORGANISATIONS ARE URGED TO INFORM THE COMMITTEE ABOUT AREAS IN WHICH THEY ARE ABLE TO PROVIDE ASSISTANCE
- THEY SHOULD ALSO PROVIDE A POINT OF CONTACT







HELP US TO COMPILE EFFECTIVE IMPLEMENTATION PRACTICES

- 1540 COMMITTEE ALSO HAS THE MANDATE TO:
 - PROMOTE THE SHARING OF EXPERIENCE, LESSONS LEARNED AND EFFECTIVE PRACTICES, IN THE AREAS COVERED BY RESOLUTION 1540 (2004) AND TO
 - IDENTIFY EFFECTIVE PRACTICES, TEMPLATES AND GUIDANCE, WITH A VIEW TO DEVELOP A COMPILATION AND POSSIBLY A TECHNICAL REFERENCE GUIDE WHICH COULD BE USED ON A VOLUNTARY BASIS
- FIRST COLLECTIONS OF SOME EFFECTIVE PRACTICES, INCLUDING IN THE FIELD OF BORDER AND EXPORT CONTROLS, CAN BE FOUND IN ANNEX XVI OF THE 2011 COMMITTEE REPORT AND IN ANNEX XVII OF THE 2008 REPORT
