

Existing domestic laws


insufficient to cover the strategic items currently regulated by international control regimes




Not designed to control strategic items that can be used for WMD purposes

THE TIMELINE FOR ENACTMENT OF STA 2010





UN Security Council Resolution – April 2010

- UNSCR 1540 OP3(d) requires all States to -
 - take and enforce effective measures to <u>establish domestic</u> <u>controls</u> to <u>prevent the proliferation of nuclear, chemical, or</u> <u>biological weapons and their means of delivery</u>, including by establishing appropriate controls over <u>related materials</u> and <u>to</u> <u>this end shall</u>
 - <u>...establish</u>, <u>develop</u>, <u>review</u> and <u>maintain</u> <u>appropriate effective</u> <u>national export and trans-shipment</u> controls over such items, <u>including appropriate laws and regulations to control export</u>, <u>transit</u>, <u>trans-shipment</u> and <u>re-export</u>..."

NB: As a UN Member State, Malaysia is bound by Articles 25 and 48 of the Charter of the United Nations to comply with and implement these obligations.








- Attorney General Chambers took the lead

- 2 June 2010 Royal Assent







Amendment of Act

- Amendments to Law require approval of Parliament – Not an easy process
- Good Regulatory Practice New Laws will have a provision for review before expiry – 5 years time frame




Amendments to Regulations and Order

- Can be taken anytime
- 1st Amendment on 1 December 2011
 - Permit application period
 - Editorial for EUS and DVS
 - Non Requirement for transhipment permit for items under Category Codes 5A2 & 5B2
- Need to be gazetted
