






This systematic approach to control WMD

Input 4 Ms LT

- All elements in the preparation of WMD (chemical weapons, biological, nuclear and missile)
- Man / Human: Personnel intermediary brokerage network in the illegal procurement
- 2. Money / Capital: Sources of investment funds
- 3. Material: Raw materials, components, machinery and equipment manufacturing
- 4. Technological: Software technology and green films
- 5. Logistics & Supply Chain: Transportation System import, export, transfer / Tran-shipment, transit. (The 3-5 is a Dual-use Goods)
- 6. Managerial: Management



Licensing System By 15 digits



Harmonized System: HS Codes

- The Export and Import Goods Act (1979)
 - Cabinet resolution of July 20, 2010 delegated to the Ministry of Commerce is the main agency in the preparation of management import export of goods that are available dual use product. (Board of directors of the export product)
- Navigating Customs Codes: HS and ECCNs
- The EU List
 - •Council Regulation (EC) No. 428/2009 includes the control list
- Factor in the production of WMD
 - 4 MLT Dual-use Goods



Licensing System by 15 digits

- Chemicals that are hazardous or arms. The importer or the exporter to declare the details of the license.
- Exporters must...
 - Obtain export license → 15 digits
 Licensing System for Tracking...Ex.
 - สธ 0810 02 3 0227 38 → Ministry of Public Health
 - กษ 0912 01 3 0030 38 → Ministry of Agriculture...
 - กห 0206 02 0 0115 41 → Ministry of Defense
 - อก **0412 02 3 0375 39** → Ministry of Industry
 - (Customs Notification 26/2544 Declaration in the list of entry permits for chemicals and hazardous materials)
 - Submit Customs Entry document(s) within 15 days after Sub gate keyed Goods Transition Control (e-Export) into the system



Risk Management System

There are 2 levels which are Central Profile & Local Profile.

High Risk: InspectLow Risk: Not inspect (Exempt)

e-Tracking


