






The EXBS Program

Created in the early 1990s to:

- Assist foreign governments in bringing export control systems up to international standards;
- Establish capabilities to detect, interdict, investigate, and prosecute illicit transfers of WMD, WMD-related materials, and conventional weapons;
- Exchange information about export control and border security "best practices";
- Support national efforts to fulfill UNSCR 1540 requirements.





The EXBS Program

OBJECTIVES


- Prevent the proliferation of weapons of mass destruction and the means to produce them
- Strengthen national export control systems
- Improve border security capabilities
- Harmonize trade controls regionally and internationally
- Build a "network of Non proliferators"



EXBS Resources

Resources:

- Directly funded by Congress and managed by U.S.
 Department of State
- Has sponsored bilateral and regional cooperative efforts worth over \$450 million
- Receives approximately \$55M annually
- Funds must be obligated within two years and expended within five years


