#### **Identified Challenges to STC Enforcement**

- Prioritization of STC enforcement with other Customs, border, and law enforcement priorities often an issue
- Having/securing the necessary political will (in general and in specific areas such as in the implementation of "catch-all" controls)
- Identifying/verifying strategic items at the frontlines and in general
- Lack of intelligence information
- Challenges to acquiring sufficient evidence of STC violations
- Difficult to monitor intangible transfers of strategic technology
- Verifying end-uses and end-users given the use of front companies
- Lack of STC awareness and training among enforcement agencies
- Bilateral cooperation and regional issues
- Consistency among different checkpoints
- STC awareness and compliance among small-and-medium enterprises

| "Greatest" STC Enforcement<br>Challenges                                       | Proposed Response/Solution  |

| Necessary political will (and competing priorities)                            | Convincing leadership that<br>nonproliferation and STC enforcement<br>are international imperatives and worth<br>the "investment" |
| Identifying/verifying strategic items and<br>ITT control challenge             | Training and "upstream awareness"<br>(industry outreach)  |
| Sufficient training for frontline officers<br>and capacity-building in general | International training programs and train-the-trainer approach  |
| Identifying end-use and end-users  | Post-shipment checks and information-<br>sharing with trade partners  |
| Inter-agency cooperation / consistency<br>across system                        | Frontline/central gov. communication<br>channel; inter-agency meetings at all<br>levels   |
