

Importance of Internal Procedures








- METI has been encouraging exporters to develop their ICPs voluntarily, and has registered them since 1987.
- ➤ METI has also been encouraging overseas subsidiaries to develop ICPs since 2005.

Number of Registered ICP exporters in Japan

Year	2008	2009	2010	2011	2012	2013
Exporters submit ICPs to METI	1,447	1,467	1,430	1,445	1,463	1,450
New Applications	88	74	65	55	48	28
Withdrawals	30	54	102	40	30	41









Procedures

Operation and Maintenance



Exporters



Can clarify their internal procedures and responsibilities.



Can minimize the risk of mistake by effective checks.



Can appeal to the public as a excellent exporter.



Can apply for a bulk export license.



Can reduce the risk of inadvertent illegal exports.




Can concentrate human resources on crucial matters.

Beneficial for both exporters and governments.




There are two types of de facto audit: Check List and On-site Inspection





- ◆ There are 41 check items.
- Exporters fill in a check list as per the following example.




On-site Inspection



- Inspect more than 100 exporters annually
- Check each exporter's implementation of its ICP
- Give advice or guidance after the inspection

Results in 2013



- If the ICP is functioning well;
 - → No instructions
- If the ICP is working but insufficient;
 - → Verbal advice
- If the ICP is not appropriate and needs to be reviewed as soon as possible;
 - → Written guidance



Examples of Advice or Guidance

■ Business evaluation

Customer evaluation should be reviewed periodically.

■ Audits

Audits should involve site visits on top of document reviews.

Document keeping

> There are no records for some businesses.




■ METI conducts **post-shipment inspection** when an export of goods or transaction of technology that is **strongly suspected of violating the Act** is discovered.

Objectives:

- 1. To find out facts and causes of a suspected case
- 2. To decide how to deal with a suspected violator
- 3. To develop preventive measures
