Key Elements of a Strategic Trade Control (STC) System

- Broad national commitment to export controls.
- Legal authority to control the export of defense-related and dual-use goods and technologies - and corresponding regulatory authorities.
- Licensing system and institutions.
- Enforcement mechanisms.
- Industry outreach and compliance.

Value of a National STC Law

- Underpins the development of the overall system.
- Helps meeting international obligations.
- Affirms commitment to nonproliferation.
- Provides the core principles underlying strategic trade licensing decisions.
- Can facilitate trade and economic cooperation.
- Undergirds a system of transparency and compliance.

Key Aspects of an STC Law

- Legislative purpose of intent.
- Relationship to other legal authorities.
- Scope and jurisdiction of the STC system.
- Authority and responsibility for implementing the STC law.
- Role of government agencies and actors.
- Assurances of public outreach and transparency.
- Requirements for documentation and confidentiality.
- Industry obligations.
- Authority to enforce and penalize.
- Mandate for international engagement.
