
UNSCR 1540 – OP3(d) requires all States to:

"take and enforce effective measures to establish domestic controls to prevent the proliferation of nuclear, chemical, or biological weapons and their means of delivery, including by establishing appropriate controls over related materials and to this end shall: establish, develop, review and maintain appropriate effective national export and trans-shipment controls over such items, including appropriate laws and regulations to control export, transit, trans-shipment and re-export....."

As the UN Member State Malaysia is bound by Article 25 and 48 of the UN Charter to comply with and implement these obligations.










Overview

STA Amendments 2017

- the amount of penalties (fine or imprisonment) for the offences committed under STA Amendment 2017 has been amended from the <u>minimum</u> <u>penalties to the maximum penalties.</u>
- <u>compoundable penalties</u> is introduced.
- <u>in line</u> with <u>international practice</u> and other export control laws which makes Malaysia more competent and may increase FDI into the country.



Overview

STA Amendments 2017

- The amendments provide more <u>specific definition</u> of brokering with exclusion of the sole provision of ancillary services such as transportation, financial services, insurance or general advertising.
- The new definition specifically mentioned that companies doing business of strategic items from <u>one</u> <u>foreign country</u> to <u>another foreign country</u> will fall under the definition of broker under STA.



STA Amendments 2017

Flexibility in EUS (Form 5) submission for the following application and activities <u>except for special permit</u> and <u>the thirteen (13) restricted countries</u>:

- Transit and transshipment activities where items are not under the ownership of the one applying for the permit.
- Single, Multiple and Bulk Permit Application subject to the relevant authorities, where applicants are unable to provide the EUS due to humanitarian need.
- where <u>end user disclosure cannot be obtained</u> due to certain business model or contractual position.


Opening Remarks

STA Amendments

Where an EUS is not available, companies **must submit** other established supporting documents which provide the similar information required in an EUS for effective evaluation purpose

Examples of supporting documents are:

- Purchase Orders;
- Invoice;
- Bill of Lading/Airway Bill;
- Letter of assurance/Certified letter;
- Packing List
- Agreement/ Contract
- Advanced manifest;






Overview

STA Amendments 2017

- The introduction of Section 12A <u>reinforces</u> law enforcement exercise as the section stated the specific occurrences which raise a <u>presumption of export of goods</u> out of Malaysia.
- Section 25A specifies authorized officers that may exercise powers of STA enforcement, thus strengthen the investigation and enforcement.
- Section 50A is the introduction of compounding offences.





New Provisons



- **Section 41** The disposal of the investigated items will be done in a more effective manner.
- Section 45 will prohibit any person from claiming the costs or damages arising from the seizure of any items from the Government of Malaysia.






